






GRACE COMMUNITY CHURCH APPRECIATION QUILT

Layered Applique Patchwork Quilt Workshop by Linda Adamcik

This will be a fun and easy workshop. Learn this simplified traditional piecing with layered patchwork method and use the Five & Dime ruler. Start with a precut (5" square & 10" square) layer, stitch, cut and rearrange for quick & easy blocks that go together in a snap! Fewer seams, less pressing, less bulk for more perfectly square blocks and flatter quilts.










NEW COMFORT BEAR KITS AVAILABLE

FAT QUARTERS FOR 2017

2017 QGbtS CHALLENGE: "WHO AM I?"

We've had mug rugs, we've had tea towels, we've had mini quilts and log cabin challenges. Our 2017 challenge theme will be inspired by **YOUR INITIALS.**

Use your initials to depict the colors, the style, and the subject of your quilt.

Example: My initials are "SFC"

- S could be used for the color---scarlet
- F could be used for the subject---flower
- C could be used for the style---crazy quilt

I would then have a crazy quilt with scarlet flowers.

or

"SFC" could stand for San Francisco, California. I could create a quilt depicting San Francisco. (Quilted example below)

CHALLENGE GUIDELINES:

The entry must:

- be any size up to and including 50" X 65"; the approximate size of a Lap Top quilt. Nothing larger.
- include at a minimum of two letters of your initials to inspire and complete your quilt as described above.
- use any quilting technique: pieced, appliqued, paper pieced, etc. Machine or hand quilted.
- have a 4" hanging sleeve on the back.
- have a label on the back right hand corner with your name, name of the person who did the quilting, the name of the quilt, and Quilt Guild by the Sea.
- be made and completed between December 1, 2016 and October 10, 2017. No Exceptions or Extensions.



TOP TEN INTERESTING QUILTING FACTS

9. Quilting can date back to 3400 BC. The oldest quilt still around today is The Tristan Quilt dated around 1360-1400.

8. World's largest quilt is the **AIDS Memorial guilt** and weighs approximately 54 tons.

7. The first rotary cutter was invented in 1979 by Olfa for garment making, but soon guilters realized the wonderful advantages to it.

6. A 2014 study showed that quilting in the United States is a \$3.7 billion industry.





5. The **same study** showed that more than 21 million people quilt, predominantly women with an average age of 62.

4. In Canada there is one national guilt organization that was founded in 1981. The Canadian Quilters' Association has 20,000 members and holds an annual conference each year that includes their National Juried Show.

3. The Dresden Plate quilt block was the most popular quilt block in

the 1920s and 30s. Although when first published in the early 20s, it had different names like Grandmother's Sunburst, Dahlia and Sunflower.

2. The first spools for thread were invented in the 1820s and used birch wood.


BOOK REVIEW: Embroidered Quilts From Hands and Hearts by Christa De Armond, Eula Lang & Kaye Spitzli

Quilting encompasses many different facets including math, art, problem solving, science, and even history. The authors of this book get their inspiration from antique blocks we see in museums, books, and quilt shows.

This book emphasizes different types of hand embroidery; it takes you from old heritage quilts to new modern ones. Piecing and applique instructions are included; there are detailed instructions, diagrams, measurements, patterns, and photographs.

If you love to do machine embroidery, the designs from this book can be incorporated into your computerized designs very easily.


