Make a wall quilt using a phrase, quotation or meaningful words as your inspiration. **The wording must be readable on the front of the quilt, in any size.** Pre-printed commercial fabric cannot be used for the inspiration wording.

All quilting techniques and surface embellishments are allowed: piecing, appliqué, embroidery, painting, foiling, beading, free-motion, etc. It's YOUR quilt!

Size: No smaller than 18x18" (or a 72" perimeter) and no larger than 24"x24" (or a 96" perimeter). Any shape is acceptable within the perimeter measurements. A hanging sleeve will be required if we are having a live meeting.

Due date: October 12, 2021 General Meeting. If the meeting is live, bring your quilt. If the meeting is via Zoom, Deb Shoemaker will need your quilt photos one week prior to the meeting.

Details: One entry per member. There will be a prize for Viewer's Choice and a prize by random drawing from among all participants. The same member cannot receive both prizes.

Some thoughts: Your inspiration can come from a statement by a famous person, from a book or movie title, from your quilting passion or from those things your mother taught you. Put on your thinking cap and have fun with it!



- Novelty and juvenile fabrics are needed as well as 2 yard measures of fabric for backings.

Comfort quilt size specifications are:

- a minimum of 38 42" wide, and a minimum of 48 54" in length. If you are using your own backing and batting and are doing your own quilting, feel free to make them wider and/or longer.
- Quilt tops should be 40" wide so that we can use one width of fabric and do not have to piece the backs.
- The size of the NICU coverlets quilts is 36" X 36".







For Knitters and Crocheters: Knit and Crocheted Caps have been well received. Additional caps have been requested.



Fidget Sleeves Reduce Stress for Dementia Patients

Although stitching together something cozy for yourself is certainly a lovely way to pass the time, a crochet project that helps others is even more gratifying. And these soothing sleeves may be our new favorite way to use handicraft skills to lend a hand. Fidget sleeves, also called twiddle muffs or cannula sleeves, are crocheted arm cuffs that can help reduce stress for people prone to anxiety and fidgeting, like those living with dementia. Knitters and crocheters are stitching them up to donate to local hospitals, hospices, and other care facilities.

Restlessness and agitation are common behaviors for those with Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia, and having something to occupy their hands can help soothe their distress. That's where fidget sleeves come in. Decorated with beads, buttons, or crocheted decorations, the cuffs provide a stimulation activity for restless hands while protecting patients' arms from picking or scratching. The sleeves can also be

made to reach farther up the arm in order to cover and protect the entry point of an IV tube or cannula. These sensory sleeves may also be helpful for individuals with autism or kids who struggle to sit still. Completely customizable, the muffs can be crocheted to any size and with any decorations desired.

One UK woman started a Facebook group called Handmade for Dementia that gathers knitters together to make fidget sleeves and other comfort items for local hospitals. The items are risk-assessed for choking hazards and other concerns before being donated.

If you know someone who could benefit from one of these sleeves, there are several Etsy sellers who offer custom cuffs with a variety of yarn colors and embellishments. If you're a knitter or crocheter yourself, you can DIY a fidget sleeve using this pattern from the Alzheimer Society of Canada. (Bonus: The project is perfect for using up scrap yarn and extra baubles!)

To find out where to donate your crocheted fidget sleeve, start by contacting local senior living facilities and hospitals to see if they'll accept fidget sleeves for dementia patients. Your needle skills could make someone's life much more comfortable.


