










Do you have blocks you made in workshops, or started a quilt only to discover after a making a few blocks that you really don't like it? 
We shall see wondrous things created from these blocks. Anyone interested in this committee, see Karen at the meeting to sign up.

KOMOCHI KUME IGETA (Grouped well-curb whirlpool)

Inspired by geometric kamon (family crests)

Choose 2 Fat Quaters

Color B: cut four 6" x 3" + four 1 1/1" x 3"

Color A: cut four 2 1/2" x 1 1/2" + one 2 1/2" square + four 1 1/2" squares



Following the diagram, lay out the pieces close to your sewing machine before you begin sewing. Because this block has several similar pieces, so arranging the block before will help you avoid sewing in the wrong order.


Sew all with 14" seam. Sew clean and cut the extra threads as you go.

-Sew one 1 ½" B square + one 1 ½" x 3"A + one 1 ½" x 2 ½"B together. Press seams and repeat 3 times to make 4 unit #1

-Lay units #1 as shown in the diagram; sew a unit #1 to a $6^{\prime\prime}$ x $3^{\prime\prime}$ A. Press towards the large A rectangle. Repeat 3 times to make four unit #2.

B B

Refer to "Part-Sew Seam", sew units #2 to the center square B on at a time. Press.



This block measures 9 1/2" square

Using different Fat Quarters, make a second block




Part Sewn Seams

This arrangements of strips around a center square copies a feature seen in Japanese architecture and flooring. Design such as the Komochi Kume Igeta (the February block for Build a Quilt) require the first seam to be only partly sewn, as little as 1" is enough.

 Assemble the outer units as shown in the block instructions. With right sides together, line up the first 2 pieces. Sew but only sew part of the seam such as 1" as indicated in the diagram below. Press the seam toward the outer unit.



Continue to assemble the lock adding each unit but this time sew the whole seam. Press towards the outside seam each time. When the final section has been sewn to the block, complete the first seam, the Part Sewn Seam, overlapping the original stitches.



BOOK REVIEW


STRIP THERAPY by Brenda Henning

Whether you make your own jelly rolls or buy them already cut and rolled, you might find this book interesting and useful. Perhaps even motivating. These projects are more complicated than the jelly roll race but more challenging. You might not need any special tools. The directions are well written and quilter specific. Some of the patters are old favorites like Braid and Ribbon Star. I think the quilts could be scrappy or planned. Keep the thin but very complete book in mind when those 2 1/2" strips pile up.



APPLIQUE by Lucinda Gandeton

If you like Applique, using your favorite technique, this fun little book could be for you. The content of the book is based on all sorts of projects. Topics covered range from easy, bold and clear to more complicated like broderie perse and fancy trims. There is a huge amount of color used both graphically and photographed. The embroidery section is very user friendly. You will find ideas for children's projects, kitchen, apparel, and home décor. Some projects are quite detailed from start



to finish. Others give you a head start with lots of samples and ideas. It's also a great book if you are looking for easy and interesting gifts.

























