MYSTERY QUILT

To be announced at the January Meeting

This year, the Guild will do a Mystery quilt. What is a Mystery Quilt? A Mystery Quilt is a quilt that you make without knowing what the final quilt will look like. Each month, cutting and sewing directions will be in the Newsletter. You should complete a section at a time. At the end of 5 months, you will have a beautiful lap size quilt (approximately 53" x 73"). This is a fun and easy quilt with only a few matching seams. We know you will absolutely love this quilt.



FABRIC REQUIREMENTS: (Use any colors that you like)

- ♦ 2 yards light background fabric
- 2 3/8 yards dark coordinating fabric
 (I suggest solids or color on color for the background and coordinating fabrics)
- ◊12 fat quarters each a different color

CUTTING DIRECTIONS FOR SECTION I

From Dark Background cut (7) 1" strips in half so that you have (14) 1" x approximately 20" strips.

From each Fat Quarter cut (1) 4" Strip. Cut a second strip from (2) of the Fat Quarters so you have a total of (14) 4" strips.

INVITATION EXTENDED TO QGbtS MEMBERSHIP

JAN KRENTZ'S "ONE BLOCK WONDER" WORKSHOP JANUARY 17 & 18, 2018

Jan Krentz is best known for her work in 8-pointed Lone Stars and related patterns. This workshop features Jan's decades-long quilt making expertise and clever construction techniques for the popular stack-cut "One Block Wonder" and "Stack 'n' Whack" quilts.

The quilt was created by layering six identical 24" repeats of one printed fabric (Harajuku Lady by Alexander Henry), cutting through all the layers to create identical stacks of equilateral 60° triangles. A second fabric was used to create a narrow black fabric trim embellishment border to separate the pieced center from the (3rd fabric) outside border.

The "One Block Wonder" two-day workshop will be held at the Boca Raton Community Center on January 17 & 18. The fee for the two-day workshop is \$100. Those interested can contact Carol Stoltenberg:




BOOK REVIEW: Thinking Outside the Block

HOW TO CUT A LARGE SQUARE WITH A SMALL RULER

Today, I would like to go over one simple trick that comes in handy from time to time. It is so simple, that I almost feel silly mentioning it. But nevertheless, I think every quilter should carry it in her or his bag of tricks. It can save you a lot of wasted pieces of fabric and some frustration.


Here it is:

How to cut a large square into half-square triangles using a rotary cutter if the longest ruler you have around happens to be smaller than the diagonal of that square. (Hint: Moving the ruler up and down the path is the wrong way of doing it.)


So here you are, with a ruler and a large square piece of fabric.




As it turns out (of course!) the ruler is too small to do the job properly.



Here is what you do. Fold the piece diagonally (shown on the left). Press hard along the fold line and unfold (shown on the right).









HOW TO CUT A LARGE SQUARE WITH A SMALL RULER (Continued)


Fold the piece along the other diagonal, perpendicular to the original fold line (which is illustrated as a black and white strip here).



The folded square can be approached as a smaller triangle with two layers of fabric and a fold line (the first one) indicating the place to cut. The ruler should be long enough to cover it completely.



Cut along the line and unfold both resulting pieces. You are done.








Advice from a Singer Sewing Manual 1949

Prepare yourself mentally for sewing. Think about what you are going to do... Never approach sewing with a sigh or lackadaisically. Good results are difficult when indifference predominates. Never try to sew with a sink full of dishes or beds unmade. When there are ur-

gent housekeeping chores, do these first so your mind is free to enjoy your sewing...When you sew, make yourself as attractive as possible. Put on a clean dress. Keep a little bag of French chalk near your sewing machine to dust your fingers at intervals. Have your hair in order, powder and lipstick on... If you are constantly fearful that a visitor will drop in or husband will come home and you will not look neatly put together, you will not enjoy your sewing as you should.
