UPCOMING WORKSHOPS:

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IMPROVISATIONAL DESIGN-MODERN **MEDALLION WORKSHOP by Debbie** Kraikowski

A Medallion Quilt is a quilt with a center block, surrounded by multiple borders. We will discuss how to take this old traditional favorite and make it modern. We will explore the basic units of quilting - squares or rectangles, half-square triangles, flying geese and quarter-square trian-

gle. Incorporate blocks made from these units in your borders. And yes, we will start with the borders first. Let's learn some new

skills and gain confidence in designing on the go. Debbie's personal goal is for everyone's quilt to be unique and original. Let's sew some things, change our mind, make some other things, designing and rearranging as we go. The design wall will become your favorite tool.

Mystery Quilt Cutting and Sewing Directions May 2018

Section IV BORDERS

BORDER #1

Cutting Directions for Border #1 (B-1)

From light fabric, cut (5) $2'' \times \text{width of fabric strips (B-1)}$ for Border #1.

Sewing Directions for Border #1 (B-1)

Sew the 2" strips (B-1) together end to end. Cut the side borders to measure 2' x 56 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (or side measurements of quilt) and add to the quilt.

Cut the top and bottom borders to measure $2' \times 39''$ (or top and bottom measurements of quilt and add to quilt.

Trim border #1 down to $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " after sewing onto quilt. (Note, the borders were cut larger in case you don't sew straight. Trimming will insure a straight border.)

BORDER #2

Cutting Directions for Border #2 (B-2)

From dark fabric, cut (3) 2" x width of fabric strips for Border #2 Sides (B-2). From dark fabric

Cut (3) 2"x width of fabric strips for Border #2 Top and Bottom (B-3)

Sewing Directions for Border #2

Sew the 2" dark strips (B-2) together end-to-end. Cut the border to measure 2" by length of sides and add to the quilt. Trim border down to 1 ½" after sewing onto quilt.

Sew the 2" dark strips (B-3) end-to-end. Cut the top and bottom borders to measure 2' x length of top and bottom and add to the quilt. Trim border down to $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " after sewing onto quilt.

BORDER #3

Cutting Directions:

From Dark Fabric cut (2) 5" x5" squares. From one color fat quarter cut (2) 5" x 5" squares. These will make (4) half square triangles.

Sewing Directions:

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the (2) fat quarter fabrics. Put dark fabric and fat quarter squares together (RST) and sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on both sides of the drawn line. Cut in half on the drawn line. Press and square up to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". These are corner pieces.

Add these (4) corner pieces to both ends of the top and bottom border strips you previously made and set aside in Section I.

BORDER #4

Cutting Directions:

From dark fabric, cut (6) 2"x length of fabric strips for border #4.

Sewing Directions:

Sew strips together end-to end. Cut the strips to the length of the top and bottom of the quilt and sew. Cut the side strips to the length of the sides of the quilt and sew. Trim border #4 to $1 \frac{1}{2}$ ".

A Quilt of Valor was awarded by Quilt Guild by the Sea to Mr. John Stamatellos; he was in the Air Force in Vietnam.






QOV PRESENTATION:















Quilts of Valor: Fair and Square

Block should measure 10 ½" x 10 ½"

Sewing Instructions:

- 1. Draw diagonal line on the wrong side of four 3" squares.
- 2. To make the triangles place one 3" square on the corner of the $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square with right sides together. Check diagram.
- 3. Sew on the diagonal line. Trim the fabric to ¼". Press the seam to triangle.
- 4. Repeat on the other 3 corners of the large square. Press.
- 5. Using diagram sew one 3" square (corner) to one 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to another 3" corner square.
- 6. Sew the remaining rectangles of the center from step 4.
- 7. Assemble the 3 rows together.


Cutting Instructions for Each Block:

- 1. Use 100% cotton fabric.
- 2. Sew skimpy 1/4" seams to allow for the fabric lost in pressing.
- 3. Use patriotic colors to make the block. Background can be white, cream, tan or beige to coordinate with other fabrics.

Color A	Cut four squares 3" x 3" (corners)
Color A	Cut one square $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " (center)
Color B	Cut four rectangles 3" x 5 ½"
Color C	Cut four squares 3" x 3" (triangles)

Block should measure 10 ½" x 10 ½"

Sewing Instructions:

- 1. Sew one 3" block to 3" block of alternating color. Press to the dark.
- 2. Using diagram sew 2 patch into a 4 patch.
- 3. Sew one 5 ½" square to one 4 patch.
- 4. Sew two rows together.


Cutting Instructions for Each Block:

- 1. Use 100% cotton fabric.
- 2. Sew skimpy 1/4" seams to allow for the fabric lost in pressing.
- 3. Use patriotic colors to make the block. Background can be white, cream, tan or beige to coordinate with other fabrics.

Cut two squares 5 ½" x 5 ½"	В
Cut four squares 3" x 3" (blue)	С

Quilts of Valor: Framed Nine Patch

Block should measure 10 ½" x 10 ½"



Sewing Instructions:

- Using diagram to sew the center, sew a nine patch using 2 ½" squares.
- 2. Sew one 2 ½" X 6 ½" rectangle to two sides of center.
- 3. Sew corner to side 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle for top and bottom.
- 4. Sew three rows together.

Time to make another??

Cutting Instructions for Each Block:

- 1. Use 100% cotton fabric.
- 2. Sew skimpy 1/4" seams to allow for the fabric lost in pressing.
- 3. Use patriotic colors to make the block. Background can be white, cream, tan or beige to coordinate with other fabrics.

Color A	Cut eight 2 ½" squares
Color B	Cut four 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles
Color B	Cut one 2 ½" square
Color C	Cut four 2 ½" squares


Quilts of Valor: Whirly Girly

Block should measure 10 1/2" x 10 1/2"



Sewing Instructions:

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the two light 4 1/8" squares.
- 2. Place each of those light squares right sides together with the other two 4 1/8" squares. Sew 1/4" inch on each side of drawn line. Cut on drawn line. Press seam to dark.
- 3. Sew a C square to a D square making four rectangle units.
- 4. Using diagram sew squares and rectangles together.


Cutting Instructions for Each Block:

- 1. Use 100% cotton fabric.
- 2. Sew skimpy 1/4" seams to allow for the fabric lost in pressing.
- 3. Use patriotic colors to make the block. Background can be white, cream, tan or beige to coordinate with other fabrics.

Color A	Cut two 4 1/8" squares	
Color B	Cut two 4 1/8" squares	
Color C	Cut five 2 ½" squares	
Color D	Cut four 2 ½" squares	

Quilts of Valor: Sawtooth Star

Block should measure 10 1/2" x 10 1/2"



Sewing Instructions:


1. On A (Star Points) draw a diagonal line on the back of each. Place A at the left end of D (Background Side) right sides together. Stitch on drawn line. Trim seam to ¼". Press triangle toward the corner. Place second star point on the right side of D. Repeat directions. Units should measure 3 ½" x 4 ½". Repeat to make four.











2. Lay out units and remaining pieces as in drawing at right. Sew units together in rows, pressing seams as indicated by arrows inside block diagram. Sew rows together and press away from center row as shown with arrows beside block. Trim to straighten the edges if needed. Must be 10 ½" inches square.


Cutting Instructions for Each Block:

- 1. Use 100% cotton fabric.
- 2. Sew skimpy 1/4" seams to allow for the fabric lost in pressing.
- 3. Use patriotic colors to make the block. Background can be white, cream, tan or beige to coordinate with other fabrics.

Star Points	Cut eight squares 2 ½" x 2 ½"	A
Center Square	Cut one square 4 ½" x 4 ½"	В
Background - Corners	Cut four squares 3 ½" x 3 ½"	С
Background – Sides	Cut four rectangles 3 1/2" x 41/2"	D

Quilts of Valor: Friendship Star

Block should measure 10 ½" x 10 ½"




Sewing Instructions:

 Using A and D, place A at right end of D. Sew diagonally from corner to corner as in diagram at right. Be sure to sew them all at the angle shown. Press toward corner to make triangle. Trim excess to leave ¼" seam allowance. Unit should measure 3 ½" x 4". Repeat to make four.







 Lay out units and remaining pieces as in drawing at left. Sew units together in rows, pressing seams as indicated by arrows inside block diagram. Sew rows together and press away from center row as shown with arrows beside block. Trim to straighten the edges if needed.

- 1. Use 100% cotton fabric.
- 2. Sew skimpy 1/4" seams to allow for the fabric lost in pressing.
- 3. Use patriotic colors to make the block. Background can be white, cream, tan or beige to coordinate with other fabrics.





