THE 2021 QUILT CHALLENGE "WORDS TO THE WISE"

Make a wall quilt using a phrase, quotation or meaningful words as your inspiration. The wording must be readable on the front of the quilt, in any size. Preprinted commercial fabric cannot be used for the inspiration wording.



All quilting techniques and surface embellishments are allowed: piecing, appliqué, embroidery,

painting, foiling, beading, free-motion, etc. It's YOUR quilt!

Size: No smaller than 18x18" (or a 72" perimeter) and no larger than 24"x24" (or a 96" perimeter). Any shape is acceptable within the perimeter measurements. A hanging sleeve will be

required if we are having a live meeting.

Due date: October 12, 2021 General Meeting. If the meeting is live, bring your quilt. If the meeting is via Zoom, Deb Shoemaker will need your quilt photos one week prior to the meeting.

Details: One entry per member. There will be a prize for Viewer's Choice and a prize by random drawing from among all participants. The same member cannot receive both prizes.

Some thoughts: Your inspiration can come from a statement by a famous person, from a book or movie title, from your quilting passion or from those things your mother taught you. Put on your thinking cap and have fun with it!





- Keep making Comfort Quilts, Hats and Isolette Covers ... they are much appreciated!
- Needed: Men's and teenage boy/boy Comfort quilts.
- Juvenile Comfort Quilts are needed in Trauma Centers. Crib size is suggested.
- Novelty and juvenile fabrics are needed as well as 2 yard measures of fabric for backings.

My cutting mat has been neglected for quite some time and needs a refresh. There are fibers stuck in grooves it has something that I think are tea stains (oops), and it needs a BATH.

First step is prep. I take an eraser and go along all the lines and grooves to get out any fibers. Mmm dusty! You can also use a lint roller, or packaging tape if you don't have an eraser on hand.

Next, I use a soft damp cloth to give it a good wash, using mild soap. I like this cloth because it prevents more fibers from attaching themselves to the mat.

Next stop is the tub. It's a good idea to hydrate your cutting mat once in a while, in room temperature water with a bit of white vinegar. I use about a cup for water I add to my tub. Never use warm, hot, or very cold water as this can cause warping and cracking to your mat. We are trying to prolong life here, not shorten it!


My mat doesn't fit flat in my tub, so I just do 5 minutes and then turn it. Since we are using room temp water here this is fine for where I live. Use your best judgement if you are in a hotter or cooler environment.

Finally, take your mat out and gently dry with towels. Leave it to dry for about half an hour before use, keeping it away from direct, bright sunlight.

It's all refreshed now and ready to go back into service!

I've learned in life that good tools (and shoes!) are worth the investment, but we must invest a bit of time into their care as well.

Things You Might Not Know About Bobbins

Things You Might Not Know About Bobbins

"Bobbin!" is a swear word in my house. My husband and I both make quilts, so we have two sewing machines and our mid-arm quilting machine to run out of bobbin thread. The wise women say that you should always wind 5 bobbins at the start of any quilt. What they don't tell you is that the last one will always run out anyway!



Given how often that word gets used, I decided to do a little research into bobbins. This article won't tell you everything you need to know about bobbins. You would need a book for that. However, it can make you aware of what deserves your further attention.

In history, bobbins were made to hold wire, yarn, and thread in sewing machines, cameras, and electronic equipment. In other fiber arts, bobbins are also used in spinning, weaving, knitting, and lacemaking.

Bobbins come in different sizes, shapes, and materials. They come pre-wound, or you can wind them on your machine or use a separate bobbin winder. Some come with holes, some don't. They have names like "L" for the regular sewing machine or "M" for a long-arm.

They have names like "15" and "15J" for different brands of sewing machines. Some are flat, some are more domed. The number of holes can vary from none to many. Some are plastic, some are metal. Some are aluminum, some are steel. Some bobbins drop in from the top and some insert from the front.



What you need to know is that THEY ARE NOT INTERCHANGEABLE!

The purpose of the bobbin case is tension. The sewing machine must have this tension for the bobbin thread to interlock with the top thread to create a stitch. If the bobbin is the wrong size or type or material, the bobbin case can't do its job. If you have more than one machine, please remember to mark your bobbins or store them separately! We

bought blue tinted bobbins for my husband's machine and clear for mine, and we do store them separately.

If you purchase a secondhand machine, it may come with the wrong bobbins or no bobbins at all. You must do the research to get the right bobbins. A local quilt shop may also be able to help you.



Things You Might Not Know About Bobbins (Cont'd)

Here's a quick list of ways that your bobbin can stop your machine:

- Cleaning the bobbin case of the machine is critical. The dust that accumulates can be the size of a dust bunny!
- Plastic bobbins can overheat and distort.
- If you normally use plastic bobbins, a heavier metal bobbin can change the tension.
- For your bobbin winder, the rubber ring can become worn.

For the advanced sewer, I want to mention something called "bobbin work". This is a technique that uses a decorative thread in the bobbin to create stitches that embellish the quilt.

On the good side, bobbins can be worn as jewelry. Folks make earrings and necklaces. At our last Bee retreat, we initiated the new retreaters with a bobbin necklace and a pledge to uphold the purpose of the retreat. We called this the "Order of the Bobbin"! This creates some humor in the inevitable cry of "bobbin" at retreat!






GREAT IDEA!

" I do not use the blanket stitch to bind, the purpose of the picture is to show how placing stitch lines on your thumb to guide you in your normal binding stitch for where your needle goes in/out to be more accurate in stitch length,



I wanted to share a tip I learned years ago for keeping stitches even when sewing binding on. I get a little OCD with stitch placement lol. Just thought someone else out there might like this idea. Just make sure your marks are dry before you start sewing so not to smear on your fabric."


