PRESIDENT'S LETTER:

At our December meeting, we will celebrate the holidays. Rochelle and her committee have planned a fun gathering for us. I look forward to seeing your festive outfits and your Show 'n Tell quilted creations, all of which will add to the festivity.

The Donation Quilt is lovely, and now we need to sell and buy tickets. The money netted from this project goes into QGbtS's treasury to help support activities throughout the year. The quilt will travel to the Mancuso show in January. White Glovers are still needed for us to be able to sell tickets. Please bring your calendar and volunteer to help with this if you can.

At the December Guild meeting, we will have an important item of Guild business to accomplish. The Board has approved and proposes one major change to our Bylaws as well as several very minor ones. The purpose of the major change is to allow the standing committee chairpersons to each have a vote at the Board meetings. The minor changes are 'house-keeping' items. All will be explained at the meeting, and there will be printed copies for you to examine. To enact these changes, members must vote for approval; if approved, the changes will be effective January 1, 2016. If you agree with the underlined statement above, vote 'yes' to the following:

PROPOSED Amendments to the Bylaws of QGbtS:

Article II, Section 4, lines 1 & 2: Delete "and absentee ballots received." Insert "shall prevail."

Article IV, Section 1: Delete in its entirety and replace with "The affairs of the Guild shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of four elected officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer), three appointed directors (Program, Membership, and Publications), and chairs of the Standing Committees (on-going, listed in the Policies and Procedures). All shall be members of the Guild and each individual shall have one vote. Those present at a Board meeting shall constitute a quorum. The officers shall appoint the directors, and the officers and directors shall comprise the Executive Board which at the beginning of their term shall determine and describe the standing committees in the Policies and Procedures. The Executive Board shall have the authority to temporarily enact changes to the Bylaws until either the Annual Meeting or a Special Meeting where voting on such changes can be determined by a quorum of members."

Article V, Section 8, line 2: Delete "non-".

Article V, Section 9: Delete in its entirety.

Article VI, Section 2, line 3: After "Bylaws" insert "Policies and Procedures"

Christmas Quilt Quilting Disaster Submitted by Joanne Thomson Locke

I've kept for myself one of only 2 of my 26 quilts (mainly because of the disaster I overcame, and the effort it took). "Star of Wonder" was hand pieced and hand guilted from a "Quiltmaker" December 1992 pattern by Gail Garber. It is a hexagonal guilt made up of triangular blocks, set in rows, and setting triangles which I did not realize I had to cut in 2 different directions from reserved rectangles until I had finished all the hand piecing . In 1994-1996, when I had a toddler at home, and only worked on it while watching play groups with the other moms, people were kidding me



it wouldn't be finished until 2001! By that time, there was no more background fabric to be found anywhere, not even online. So, the discovery of the "disaster" caused me to call my quilting mentor, Ruth Iseda, for help, in the middle of the night. Ruth gave me some Pellon backing to glue the wrongly cut triangles together. I proceeded to hand quilt lines parallel to the cut edges to disguise them, which took me another two and a half years, from 1998-2001. Linda Nesbitt added the binding.

Guess what, my quilt WAS finished in 2001 (an impossibly futuristic date in the nineties!), and I have used it every year since, as a background for our family Christmas stockings. Just be patient, take a break (a few years if necessary), and everything will work out eventually, especially if you have an expert quilt "sensei" like Ruth to help you!





BOOK REVIEW:

Free Motion Quilting by Angela Walters

I admit it, I am terrified to do free motion quilting. I buy books, watch videos, ask questions and try ... all to no avail. After reading this book, I am looking forward to sitting at my machine, not use the built in walking foot, and follow the advice given by the author. Although she says her designs are for modern quilts, I found them applicable for quilts, in general. She covers so much ... such as color, supplies, machines and designs, besides methods and designs. One can select a pattern and use it successfully to quilt; she calls them modern, and I call them easy. For those times that we really need to do Free Motion quilting (e.g.



small projects, gifts, something fast, etc.), this book could be very useful. This book is practical and includes all the necessities of free motion quilting including planning, borders, negative space, and so much more. There are lots of pictures, diagrams, and charts. I also found the organization most helpful. This author also has You Tube videos that I found accidentally! It would be worth looking at them, too.
