We envision future projects without a thought of where it will go when it is finished. Our patriotism is sparked when we see the "Quilts of Valor" fabric and we think about where a future QOV quilt will find a home. What about a donation of gorgeous baby prints since our babies are in their 30's and sky blue, pink, mint green, and buttery yellow is no longer in their color choices. And there are those neat new tools and notions that everyone's talking about. Oh, and what about the new books? Lots of new techniques to try and maybe sign up for that class we've been thinking about.







QUILT GUILD BY THE SEA BUILD-A-QUILT

` MY FAVOROTE THINGS'

Each month, beginning in November 2011 through June 2012 you will receive four block patterns with the same theme. Patterns will be sent via email after the monthly guild meeting.

You will choose two blocks to complete each month and set them aside. For the month of January the theme is "Your Favorite Flower". A sample of one of the patterns is to the right. Coming up in the next months will be Americana, Friendship, Housing and more.

Previous months patterns: November— "Your Favorite Pet", and December—"Your Favorite Hobby".

We suggest scrap fabrics to make these blocks. The finished top, without borders, will measure $40'' \ge 56''$.

In July, you will receive instructions for block placement and border suggestions.

In November 2012, we will have a Show & Tell featuring the quilts that each of you has created. Each quilt will have the same theme but will be different in style, color, and technique.

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INVITATION TO ENTER QUILT FESTIVAL OF IRELAND



Dear Quilter by the Sea,

My name is Caitlin Hacker. I am emailing on behalf of the International Quilt Festival of Ireland. I am contacting you to invite members of your quilt guild to show quilts at our festival and represent the guild with a quilt for one or two of our exhibits. There are two exhibits that we feel are going to gather a lot of attention. The first is the "My Quilt Garden" and the second is "Yin & Yang".

"My Quilted Garden" will transform a large room in one of NUIG's (the university campus we have turned into a Quilter's village) oldest building into what we envision will be an

extraordinary walk-in garden, with beautiful 3-D flowers, plants, shrubs, trees, grass, and even a stream, while birds are chirping, bees are buzzing and incredibly colorful flower and garden quilts line the walls to enclose the garden setting. We are offering a \$1,000 cash prize to the best entry in the exhibit.

"Yin & Yang" is more challenging. Each quilter who participates will have to create two quilts; one represents their artistic side as an art quilter and the second allows them to create something traditional. The quilts will have the same theme. The winner of this quilt entry will receive a cash prize of \$2,500.

The deadline to complete these entries is April 1, 2012. The sizes are not very large, so we feel these are very doable within the timeframe especially making 3-D flowers and plants for "My Quilted Garden".

The Cead Mile Failte quilt block entry could also be a nice contribution to the exhibit. Quilters from around the world trace their hand and make a quilt block they applique and design. The block will be sewn together with other blocks as the official "welcome exhibit" at the festival each year it is presented. Information is available on the festival website: **www.IQFOI.com**.

Finally. We would like to extend an invitation to join us in Ireland as we present our second Annual International Quilt Festival of Ireland. Maybe you would like to help us gather a small group of 20 people from your group to join us. If that is something that would interest you, we will provide you with a complimentary trip for helping put the group together. If you do not want the free trip, we will donate \$100 back to your guild for every person that joins your tour. Please let me know if this is something you might want more information about. Thanks for considering all of this. I do hope members of your guild would like to participate.

It could be really fin for members of your guild to sit around one afternoon or evening and make fabric flowers and represent your guild with a nice bundle or patch of flowers in the garden.

A MOST UNUSUAL VISIT TO THE HOSPICE and PALLIATIVE CARE OF GREENSBORO

I recently visited some special friends in Greensboro, North Carolina. My good friend, Susan, enthusiastically insisted we visit the Hospice and Palliative Care of Greensboro (HPCG). She explained that this was not an ordinary Hospice and that they had a wonderful collection of quilts; many created by volunteers. Did I really want to visit a Hospice? My knowledge of Hospice is a dreary, sad place, for end-of-life care. I promptly learned otherwise. Let me explain.

One of the Directors of HPGC welcomed us and accompanied us through the Administration Building and the Children's building, home of the Kid's Path Program, while telling us about their different programs and showing me the marvelous quilts.

The Kid's Path program struck a nerve since I have a God Daughter that was diagnosed with Leukemia at age 3. Jessie and her twin sister endured chemotherapy, bone marrow transplants, etc. and they needed as much emotional support as they could get. How do you explain to a toddler her sister can't come home from the hospital, can't play or go out ...

The Kid's Path building is bright, cheerful (wonderful quilts and art work) and the staff is welcoming and friendly. Home to a most unusual outpatient program, it is designed to enhance the quality of life for children and their families that are facing the challenge of dealing with a progressive illness or dealing with the loss of a loved one. The program realizes that children cope with illness and loss differently from an adult. Children are encouraged to explore and express their feelings in age appropriate support groups, counseling and in-school education. Additional activities for the children include the Aavy Aard-vark Puppet Show to let third graders act out their feelings associated with loss, as well as workshops, camps, and art focused on helping the children express, communicate and cope with their emotions (resentment, grief, etc.).

Getting back to the quilts ... They ranged from a Double Wedding Ring Memory Quilt to several appliqued quilts. I have included some of the photos to share with you. For me, one quilt stood out: The "Zippered Garden" Quilt was AWESOME! This quilt was designed and created by fiber artist Peg Gignoux and adorns two walls. Area children, in cooperation with the Green Hill Center for North Carolina Art, assisted in creating this work of art by cutting out individual pieces that decorate the inside of the zippered pockets.

The "Zippered Garden" quilt and the Kid's Path Program inspired me to share my thoughts and start to work on a quilt for the children of Kid's Path.
