Raine and Dotty shared their techniques and humor and joked about their color choices; Dotty, as we discovered quickly, loves blue.



Our members in attendance included: Diane Provost, Sarah Crew, Lee Hasse, Melinda Schwartz, Kathy Louderback, Linda Bouvier, Karen Pugh, and Orla Englander.

Diane Provost sent us these comments with her photos: My soldiers name is George Coleman, Iraq, 2002/2003. He was wounded but re-

integrated into society pretty well. He is now a police officer in Kentucky where he lives with his wife and two kids. He is joining the ride for the first time to encourage his younger peers. He had never received a quilt before and did not know about QOV. This big, strong man was in tears. Very moving.



Comments from Kathy Louderback: The black dog is named Henry

and he is a service dog. The tan and white dog is Rosie; also a service dog. The gentleman with me in the wheelchair is Steve Gill. Steve was from the central part of the United Kingdom. There were, I think, three guys from England on this ride. Steve thanked me so much for the quilt. He said he is expecting a son and it would be an honor to wrap him with our love.



One of the other guys from England received a quilt and thought it

was so wonderful that it did not have an American flag on it but the colors of his country! We just never know how far this love will spread.

Dear Ladies,

As I representative of Pieceful Shores Quilt Guild, I am overwhelmed with your thoughtfulness in sending those beautiful quilts. We are a guild of about 70 members, but are a schizophrenic group as half meet during the day on Long Beach Island, and the rest meet at night on the mainland in a local community center. We are displaced in both meeting places, one has to be totally rebuilt (Alce Baldwin, the actor, has donated \$250,000 to help the community). So we are on the road searching for new permanent facilities. But we are focused and will pull together as we have our Quilt Show coming up in October.

We had our Holiday party on Dec. 7 and surprised when instead of 16 members who signed up for the party, about 45 showed up. Of those, 18 women had lost either the contents of the first floor, or the total house. We came together in support with tears and laughter. Then Donna Tobruck came in with boxes and boxes of quilts from guilds across the country. It was wonderful to see the faces, of those that lost so much, get something of their own. Whatever quilts were left, were given to people in their neighborhood, or motels where people were staying, or churches were people were living.

It is with heartfelt appreciation that I thank you for your generous gifts and your thoughtfulness in our time of desperate need.






#### Applique Can Be Easy by Pat Andreatta

Because of the new and renewed interest in both hand and machine applique, I searched our guild library and found two books dedicated totally to applique.

Applique Can Be Easy is large with clear illustrations and is relatively easy to follow. It includes step by step directions using the iron/starch/template method. The author is precise in her directions. Her included designs are Rose of Sharon, tulips and other flowers. This is a spiral bound book which you can set right next to you as you prepare your pieces. Other methods could be used and/or combined with these. There is no color to distract you in using the fundamentals of this art form.



#### Better Homes and Gardens Applique


This is a very old and tired book BUT it contains lots of good information, patterns and designs. It is not as explicit as the first book yet has lots of ideas on how, where and why you could use the appliqués. I always feel quilting is timeless and you never know when inspiration, intuition and instruction come your way.

Many of our library books have lots of applique designs, uses and methods. It is relatively simple to enlarge, cut and paste to use and enjoy all the beautiful and new again patterns of our past. Reviewed by Joan Cohn



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Build -A-Quilt: Block 1

**Cutting instructions:** 

From the LIGHT 2 1/2" strip, cut four (4) 2 1/2" squares

From the MEDIUM 21/2" strip, cut four (4) 2 1/2" square & four (4) 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles.

From the DARK 1 1/2" strip, cut four (4) 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles

From the DARK 2 1/2" strip cut one (1) 2 1/2" square.

Sewing Instructions:


Refer to "Making Half-Square-Triangle" and pair four (4) 2 ½" MEDIUM squares with four (4) 2 ½" LIGHT squares. Sew the pair together to make 4 MED/LIGHT HST.





Sew a DARK rectangle & a MEDIUM rectangle together lengthwise. Press toward the DARK.Repeat 3 more times to make 4 DARK/MED rectangles.

Using an additional  $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " DARK square, lay out the units as shown. Sew the pieces together in rows and then sew the rows together to complete the block.



Block 1. Make 1.

Make one (1) block. It should measure 6 1/2" by 6 1/2", adjust your block if needed.

Identify this block as #1


Happy Piecing!

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Making Half-Square-Triangle (HST)

Cut squares the size specified in the cutting instructions.

Place two (2) squares right size together, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other, this is your sewing line. Sew on the sewing line:




Trim away the excess fabric on one side leaving  $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance as shown. Press the seam allowances toward the darker triangle.


Making Flying Geese units (FG)

Cut squares & rectangles the sizes specified in the cutting instructions. With the right sides together, place a square on one end of a rectangle. Sew diagonally from corner to corner across the square as shown:



Trim away the excess fabric, leaving ¼" seam allowance. Press the resulting triangle open






Place a second square on the other end of the rectangle, right sides together. Sew diagonally across the square as shown. Trim the excess fabric leaving  $\frac{1}{3}$ " seam allowance and press.







Note:

Test your piecing before starting your top:

Make one HST and one FG with the fabrics and thread you will be using for this quilt. Both HST & FG units should measure  $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $2 \frac{1}{2}$ ". If the measurements are off, adjust your  $\frac{1}{2}$ " sewing and be consistent throughout this whole top.
