
IS SOMEONE WEARING A FLIP FLOP PIN?

This year's Grace Community Donation quilt will be handmade or machine applique flower blocks. All are invited to participate.



- Hand or machine appliqué flower blocks
- Flowers in pastel colors (solid or prints)
- Background is white/off white (solid or tone on tone), cut a 12" sq.
- Finished appliqué may not exceed 9 1/2"sq.
- Center your design in the 12" background.
- Do not cut the background after appliqué is done,
- Pattern of your choice or you may choose a pattern from our selection.
- No embellishment on the block please.

If you have pastel fabrics to spare, please bring pieces of $6" \times 12"$ to share with other members. We will also have some fabrics for which you can pick. Patterns and pastel fabrics will be available at the July guild meeting.

Blocks are due no later then the October Guild Meeting.

RED DOOR PROJECT UPDATE





2015 QUILT CHALLENGE

Theme: "Around and Around".

Challenge Guidelines:

The entry must:

- may be any size up to and including 54" X 75".
 Nothing larger.
- may be any shape.
- must include at least one complete circle in the quilt or the entry can be a quilt without corners (circular quilt).
- may use any quilting technique: pieced, appliqued, paper pieced, etc. Machine or hand quilted.
- must have a 4" hanging sleeve on the back.
- must have a label on the back right hand corner with your name, name of the person who did the quilting, the name of the quilt, and Ouilt Guild by the Sea.
- must be made between August 12, 2014 and October 13, 2015.
- must be complete by October 13, 2015. NO Exceptions or Extensions.

BOOK REVIEW:

Sensational Sets & Borders Rodale Library

I have found a quilting book that solves just about any set or border problem, question, or decision.

A quick look at the table of contents gives a quilter a clear overview of what to look for; both pieced and appliquéd techniques will be found. You will find ideas and methods from very simple to very fussy mitered corners. Besides framing your blocks and pieces, good suggestions are offered: color, types of blocks, and styles. You will find information on filling up spaces, modifying quilts, and solving your problems.

I have found this book to be the one I would keep close by when making decisions on putting my quilt together.

Nine Patch Nirvana



Rocky Road

Size: 12"

Cutting Instructions:

*Fabric:	Size & Shape:	# to Cut:
A (Lt. Orange)	2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle	2 -
A (Lt. Orange)	4-7/8" Square	2 -
B (Blue)	5-1/4" Square	3-
B (Blue)	2-1/2" Square	4-
C (Cream)	5-1/4" Square	3
C (Cream)	1-1/2" Square	8-
C (Cream)	2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Rectangle	2-

Sewing Instructions:

Step 1: Using a ruler and a pencil, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all Color C (cream) 1-1/2" squares and Color B (blue) 2-1/2" squares.




Step 2: Using a ruler and a rotary cutter, cut each Color C (cream) 5-1/4" squares and each Color B (blue) 5-1/4" squares twice diagonally for a total of twelve triangles of each color.



Cut each twice diagonally

Step 3: With right sides together, place a 1-1/2" Color C (cream) square on the upper right corner of a Color A (lt. orange) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle. Sew along the drawn line and trim excess fabric 1/4" inch above the seam. Press seam allowance toward the lighter fabric. Repeat on the upper left corner. Repeat Step 4 once more for a total of two Color A/C units.









Sew, trim, and press on each end. Make 2.

Step 4: With right sides together, place a 2-1/2" Color B (blue) square on the right of a Color C (cream) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle. Sew along the drawn line and trim excess fabric 1/4" inche above the seam. Press seam allowance toward the darker fabric. Repeat on the left end. Repeat Step 4 once more for a total of two Color B/C flying geese units.








Sew, trim, and press on each end. Make 2.

Step 5: With right sides together, place a 2-1/" Color C (cream) square on the right of a Color A (lt. orange) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle. Sew along the drawn line and trim excess fabric 1/4" inche above the seam. Press seam allowance toward the lighter fabric. Repeat on the left end. Repeat Step 5 one more time for a total of two Color A/C flying geese units.



Sew and press. Make 2


Step 6: Sew Color B (blue) and Color C (cream) triangles together as shown below. Make two C/B and two B/C. Press seam allowance toward the darker fabric.



Step 7: Using a ruler and a rotary cutter, cut each Color A (It orange) 4-7/8" squares once diagonally for a total of four triangles. Sew the B/C and C/B triangles from Step 6 to the Color A (It orange) triangles as shown below. Press seam allowance toward the Color A (It orange) triangles.



2015 BUILD-A-QUILT—BLOCK 9 INSTRUCTIONS (Continued):



Step 8: With right sides together, layer a Color C (cream) 1-1/2" square in the corner of a Step 7 unit as shown below. Sew along the drawn line and trim 1/4" above the seam. press seam allowance towardthe darker fabric. Repeat for each remaining Step 7 unit for a total of four.



Sew, trim, and press. Make 2.




Sew, trim, and press. Make 2.

Step 9: With right sides together, layer a Color C (cream) triangle on a Color B (blue) triangle and stitch together along one short side. Press seam allowance toward the darker fabric. Repeat five more times for a total of six C/B triangles.



Step 10: With right sides together, layer an C/B triangle on another C/B triangle and stitch together along the longest side. Press the seam allowance to one side. One quarter square triangle made. Repeat twice more for a total of three quarter square triangles.



Step 11: Using the block image at the top of the page as your guide, arrange the nine block units. Sew them first into rows, pressing the seams of the top and bottom rows away from the center and the seams of the middle row toward the center. Sew rows together to finish the block and press seams toward the center.

Your block should measure 12-1/2" at this point. It will measure 12" when it is sewn into the quilt.

Cutting Instructions:

*Fabric:	Size & Shape:	# to Cut
A (Lt. Orange)	4-1/2" Square	4-
B (Blue)	2-1/2" Square	12-
B (Blue)	4-1/2" Square	1-
C (Cream)	2-1/2" Square	4-
C (Cream)	1-1/2" Square	4 -
C (Cream)	1-1/2" x 4-1/2" Rectangle	8-
C (Cream)	2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Rectangle	4-

Sewing Instructions:

Step 1: Using a ruler and a pencil, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all Color B (blue) 2-1/2" squares, Color C (cream) 2-1/2" squares, and Color C (cream) 1-1/2" squares.



Draw lines

Step 2: With right sides together, place a 2-1/2" Color C (cream) square on the upper right corner of a Color A (lt. orange) 4-1/2" square. Sew along the drawn line and trim excess fabric 1/4" inch above the seam. Press seam allowance toward the corner. Repeat in the lower left corner using a Color B (lt blue) 2-1/2" square. Repeat Step 2 three more times for a total of four diagonal units.









Sew, trim, and press

Step 3: With right sides together, place a 2-1/2" Color B (blue) square on the right end of a Color C (Cream) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle. Sew along the drawn line and trim excess fabric 1/4" inch above



the seam. Press seam allowance toward the corner. Repeat on the left end. Repeat Step 3 three more times for a total of four flying geese units.







Sew, trim, and press on each end. Make 4.


Step 4: With right sides together, sew a $1-1/2" \times 4-1/2"$ Color C (cream) rectangle to the top and bottom of each flying geese unit. Press seam allowances away from the flying geese units.

Sew and press. Make 4.

Step 5: With right sides together, place a Color C (cream) 1-1/2" square in the upper right corner of the Color B (blue) 4-1/2" square. Sew along the pencil line and trim excess fabric 1/4" above the seam line. Repeat in each of the remaining corners as shown below and press the seam allowances towards the corners.



Sew, trim, and press. Make 1.

Step 6: Using the block image at the top of the page as your guide, arrange the nine block units. Sew them first into rows, pressing the seams of the top and bottom rows away from the center and the seams of the middle row toward the center. Sew rows together to finish the block and press seams toward the center.

Your block should measure 12-1/2" at this point. It will measure 12" when it is sewn into the quilt.




