As You Sew ...

Once upon a time, long, long, ago and far, away there was a magical land called 'Perfect Quiltdom'. It was a wonderful place to live; the skies were blue, and the flowers were always in bloom. There were happy quilters everywhere; the quilter's seams were always straight, they never mis-cut their fabric, and they never, ever had to rip



out any seams...even when paper piecing. In fact, they had transformed their seam rippers into creative art objects that they placed in museums created to display their unique beauty. What a sublimely perfect place to live. The happy quilters opened their arms and invited me to live there and quilt with them... just then, I awoke with my seam ripper clutched tightly in my hand.

You see, in order to get perfectly straight lines and perfect points for my star challenge quilt, I am paper piecing. Now, I do love paper piecing, I really do; especially after finally overcoming my Scottish tendency to use pieces of fabric that are just a smidgen too small to cover the space needed. We mustn't waste fabric, right? Then, out would come the seam ripper. I have now learned to use large enough pieces... Whew, that learning curve took long enough! Now, I have abstractly sliced through a completed star point as I was cutting the next piece. Again, out with my trusty seam ripper.

I have eight (just counted them), eight seam rippers. I am always on a quest for the perfect seam ripper, wherever I go. My favorite one has a light and a magnifying glass. And let me say, it is a lethal weapon since Deb's husband sharpened it.

Of course, I have stabbed myself several times and had to go running to wash off the blood before it got on my quilt. I do love this one best and have named it "AI" after Deb's husband.

As I am making this quilt and writing this letter, the quote, "As you

sew, so shall you rip." keeps running through my head. Thanks to Orla, this is now my mantra.





Build -A-Quilt: Block #5



Cutting instructions:

From 2 ½" DARK strip, cut sixteen (16) 2 ½" squares + sixteen (16) 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles.

From 2 ½" MEDIUM strip, cut thirty-two (32) 2 ½" squares + thirty-two (32) 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles

From 2 1/2" LIGHT strip, cut twenty-four (24) 2 1/2" squares + sixteen (16) 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles


From 1 1/2" LIGHT strip, cut sixteen (16) 1 1/2" squares.

Sewing Instructions:

Refer to "Making Half-Square-Triangle" and pair two (2) 2 ½" DARK squares with two (2) 2 ½" MEDIUM squares. Sew the pairs together to make 2 DARK/MEDIUM HST.

Refer to "Making Half-Square-Triangle" and pair two (2) 2 ½" MEDIUM squares with two (2) 2 ½" LIGHT squares. Sew the pair together to make 2 MED/LIGHT HST.

Refer to "Making Flying Geese" and sew one (1) Light $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " square to one end of a $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " DARK. Make two (2) different rectangles following the diagrams below. Trim the excess fabric leaving $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance and press toward the DARK.



Sew one (1) LIGHT rectangle and one (1) MEDIUM rectangle, right sides together, lengthwise. Press the seam toward the MEDIUM. Repeat to make two (2) units.


Lay out one LIGHT 2 %" square in the center and the other units around it using the diagram as reference. Sew the pieces in rows and then sew the rows together to complete the block.

Repeat 7 times to make8 identical 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" unfinished blocks


Identify these blocks as #5

Happy Piecing!









WB = White Background Fabric

Option:

When paper piecing is finish, use a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF strip in Medium or Dark color to frame your hearth block.

Start sewing the strip on the 2 sides, press. And then sew the strip to the top & bottom, press.
