PRESIDENTS MESSAGE


Hi, y'all,

All of the quilting is not finished, but will be shortly. I've got workshops coming up that I've done the prep work, collected materials, and created outlines for them. I've cleaned my sewing room 3 TIMES!!!!! I'm taking some on-line classes, I have 2 new quilting students, and in between all this, I have sports events to attend for my grandchildren. I also have guild related meetings and activities, a once a week bee, physical therapy and when I get a chance, I get to have lunch with my best friend or spend a day with my husband. The guilt pattern, Sam and Company, was designed by Nan-Hieronymus Barrett, and is used with the designer's permission.

On February 29th members of the Gold Coast along with a few members of our guild and some from East Sunrise organized a QOV workshop and an occasion for some soldiers and members of the VA Hospital curious to see how the quilts are being made, to visit. After about three hours working on QOV quilts, we were visited by soldiers, VA Social Workers, Therapists, Health Care Specialists, etc. They put together a presentation for us that included 4 person Honor Guard joined by a trumpet play-



er, and the soldiers that received the quilts were introduced by Sheryl Valdes, a representative of the VA Hospital. Several soldiers who had received quilts told us how they felt when they were offered these quilts after coming back from Afghanistan, Iran, &/or the Gulf War. Some of the stories were funny, and some others were very emotional.

The three Guilds represented at this event received a Certificate of Appreciation from the Department of Veterans Affairs. I was honored to receive the certificate, and it is with pride that I accepted it in the name of our guild for all of your dedicated work for the veterans.



After the presentations, we had the opportunity to meet the Staff from the VA Hospital, the soldiers and their wives and kids, A wife of a retired soldier told her story; very emotional. This was a very special workshop; one that I will always remember.

BUTTONWOOD SOLID FABRIC CHALLENGE

Anything sewn or made incorporating at least two Northcott Colorworks solids. You can add any other fabric to your project of your choice.

Challenge Dates: February 1—April 30, 2012

Purchase your fabrics and make your project due at Buttonwood Quilt Shop by April 30, 2012. Projects will be displayed for patrons of Buttonwood Quilts to vote for their favorite between May 1 and May 12, 2012. Winners will be announced Monday, May 14, 2012.

Rules: You must purchase at least two yards of Northcott Solid fabric from Buttonwood Quilt Shop. You may use as much or as little of the solid fabric in your project; however you must purchase two yards (this can be any quantity totaling 2 yards such as eight fat quarters).

Prizes: 1st Prize Winner will receive a \$50.00 Gift Certificate from Buttonwood Quilts, 2nd Prize Winner will receive a \$25.00 Gift Certificate and the 3rd Prize winner will receive a prize worth \$15.00 .

QUILT GUILD BY THE SEA BUILD-A-QUILT

`MY FAVOROTE THINGS'

Each month, beginning in November 2011 through June 2012 you will receive four block patterns with the same theme. Patterns will be sent via email after the monthly guild meeting.

You will choose two blocks to complete each month and set them aside. For the month of February the theme is a Dress & Tea Pot or a Healing Heart & Ribbon. Coming up in the next months will be Americana, Friendship, Housing and more.

We suggest scrap fabrics to make these blocks. The finished top, without borders, will measure $40'' \times 56''$.

In July, you will receive instructions for block placement and border suggestions.

In November 2012, we will have a Show & Option B - Show & Tell featuring the quilts that each of you has created. Each quilt will have the same theme but will be different in style, color, and technique.

Daisy 12" block (123% x 12 x minimised, paper pieces)

Print 4 of the templates from page 2 on foundation paper.

Paper piece block A & B and join them together,

Make 4 A-B Blocks

Option A:

- Sew one C to each A-B blocks

Option B:

 Ignore the C piece
 Make a circle template to replace C
 Appliqué this circle in the center of the block making sure to cover al the raw edges.
